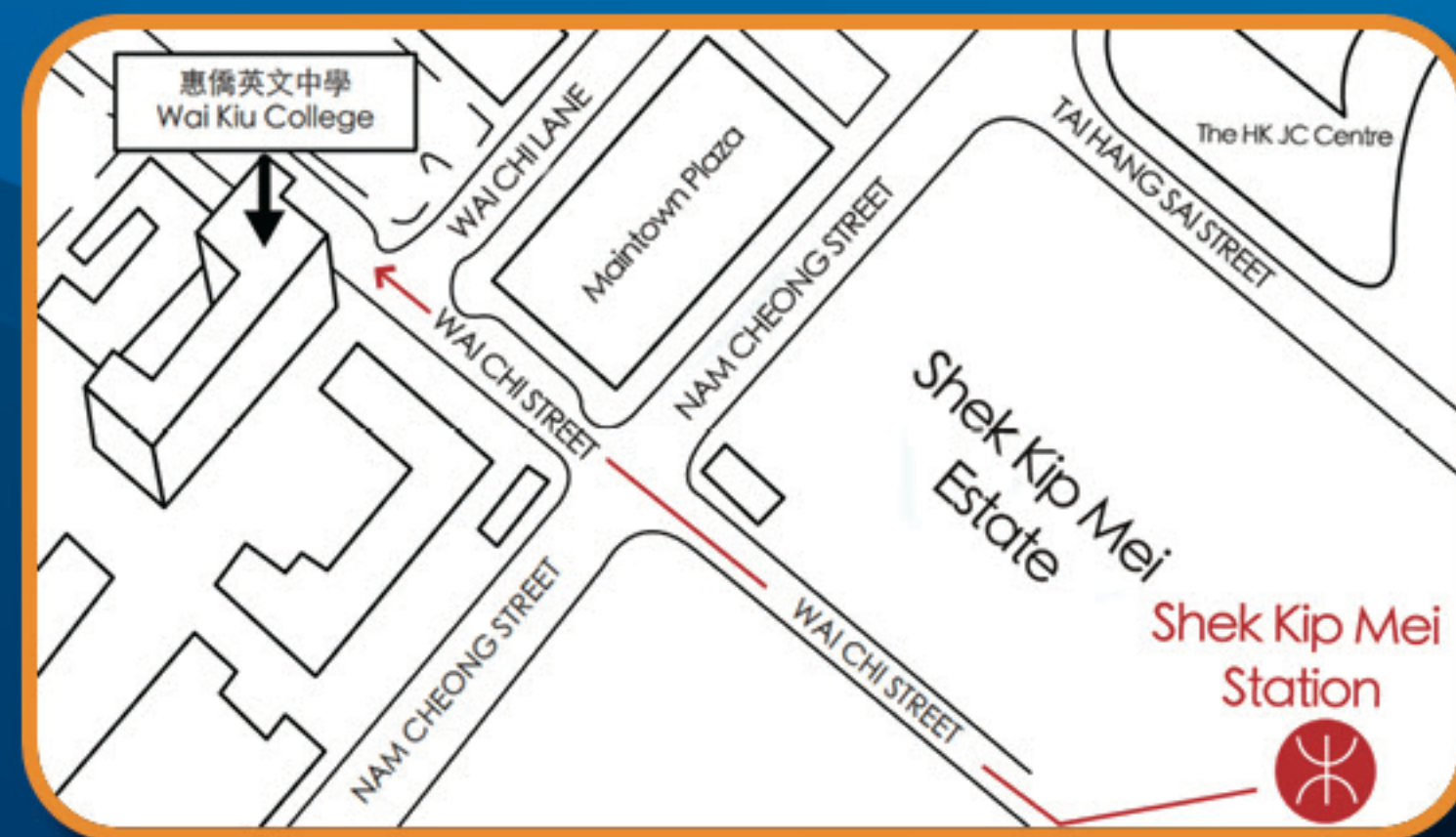

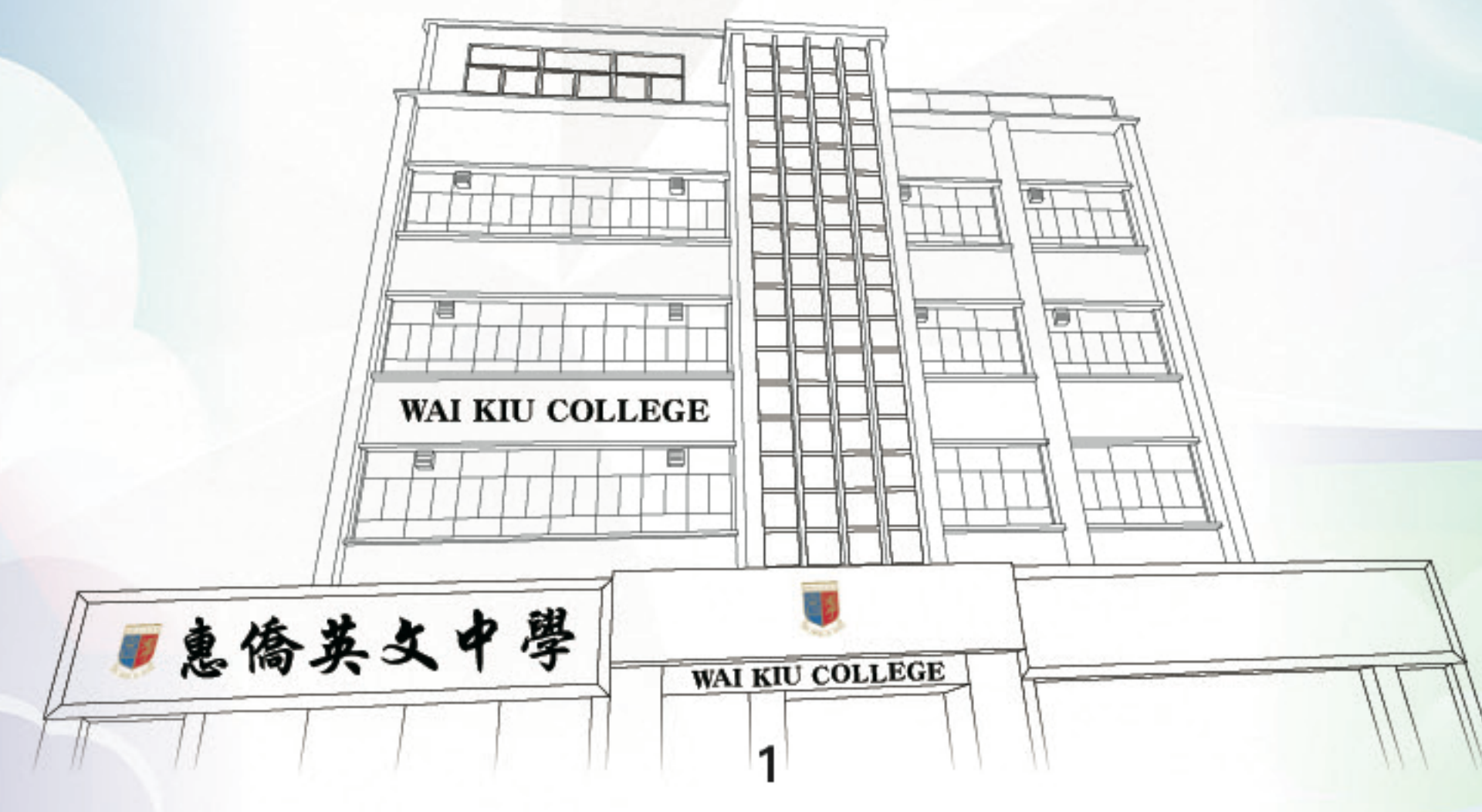
School Information

- Mission : The school adopts "Whole-person Education" as its mission. While imparting knowledge and skills, it emphasizes character development, resilience, and independent thinking, helping students cultivate a positive and proactive outlook on life.

- Motto : **Perseverance, Responsibility, Loyalty, and Diligence**

In the early years, Sham Shui Po District faced a shortage of schools, sparking the idea of establishing a school for the community. In 1953, notable figures including LO Kuk-kiu, LAU Shing, YEUNG Siu-bo, LO Yee-nin, and NGAI Yee-chak founded "Wai Kiu School" in a tenement building on Shek Kip Mei Street. Despite humble beginnings, they laid the foundation for educating underprivileged students in the district.

With foresight, the Wai Yeung Merchants Association took over the school in 1958, committing to the mission of education. To address the growing student population, the "New School Expansion Committee" was formed in 1961. Dedicated members such as CHUNG Yuk-hing, HUI Yeung-shing, CHEUNG Koon-shing, HO Sau-hong, WONG Fuk-kei, LAM Tak-cheung, HUI Kwok-ho, and YEUNG Siu-bo worked tirelessly to raise funds and eventually established a new campus on Wai Chi Street. As student numbers continued to rise, a member of the school management board, Mr. CHEUNG Koon-shing generously donated \$3 million to further expand the campus, reflecting the Association's unwavering dedication to education.

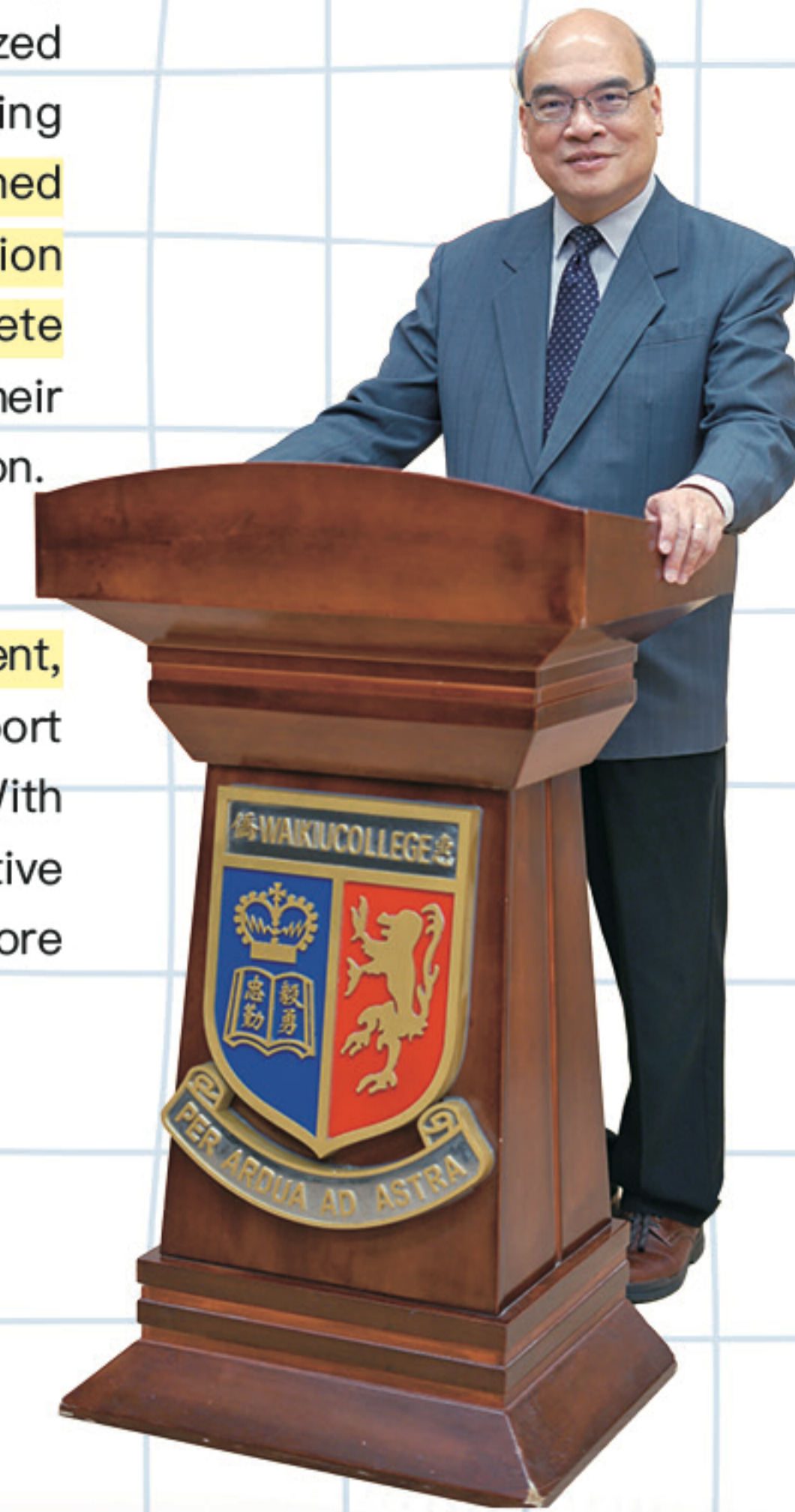
Over the decades, the school has continually evolved. It was upgraded to a private secondary school in 1968. In the 1990s, it joined the "Buying Place Scheme" to align with educational developments. By 1999, the Association established Wai Yeung Merchants Association Education Fund, successfully transitioning the school into a "Direct Subsidy Co-educational Grammar School." Through half a century of challenges, the Wai Yeung Merchants Association has remained steadfast in its commitment to nurturing talent, providing quality education for students in the district.





Academically, our graduates have gained admission to prestigious local and overseas universities, such as The University of Hong Kong, majoring in English Language and other specialized subjects. Our alumni are also shining in various fields, including Legislative Council Member Mr. CHOW Man-kong, JP, esteemed educator Principal Wong Kin-ho, Hong Kong Basketball Association Senior Coach Mr. CHEUNG Tsz-lung, Olympic taekwondo athlete Mr. LO Wai-fung and badminton player Mr. YEUNG Pui-lam. Their achievements reflect the profound impact of our school's education.

Looking ahead, we will uphold our ethos of nurturing confident, purposeful youth with a spirit of service. We will continue to support students' holistic growth in academics, character, and talents. With our dedicated teaching staff, experienced leadership, and supportive Board of Directors, I am confident our school will empower more young people to achieve their dreams and contribute to society.

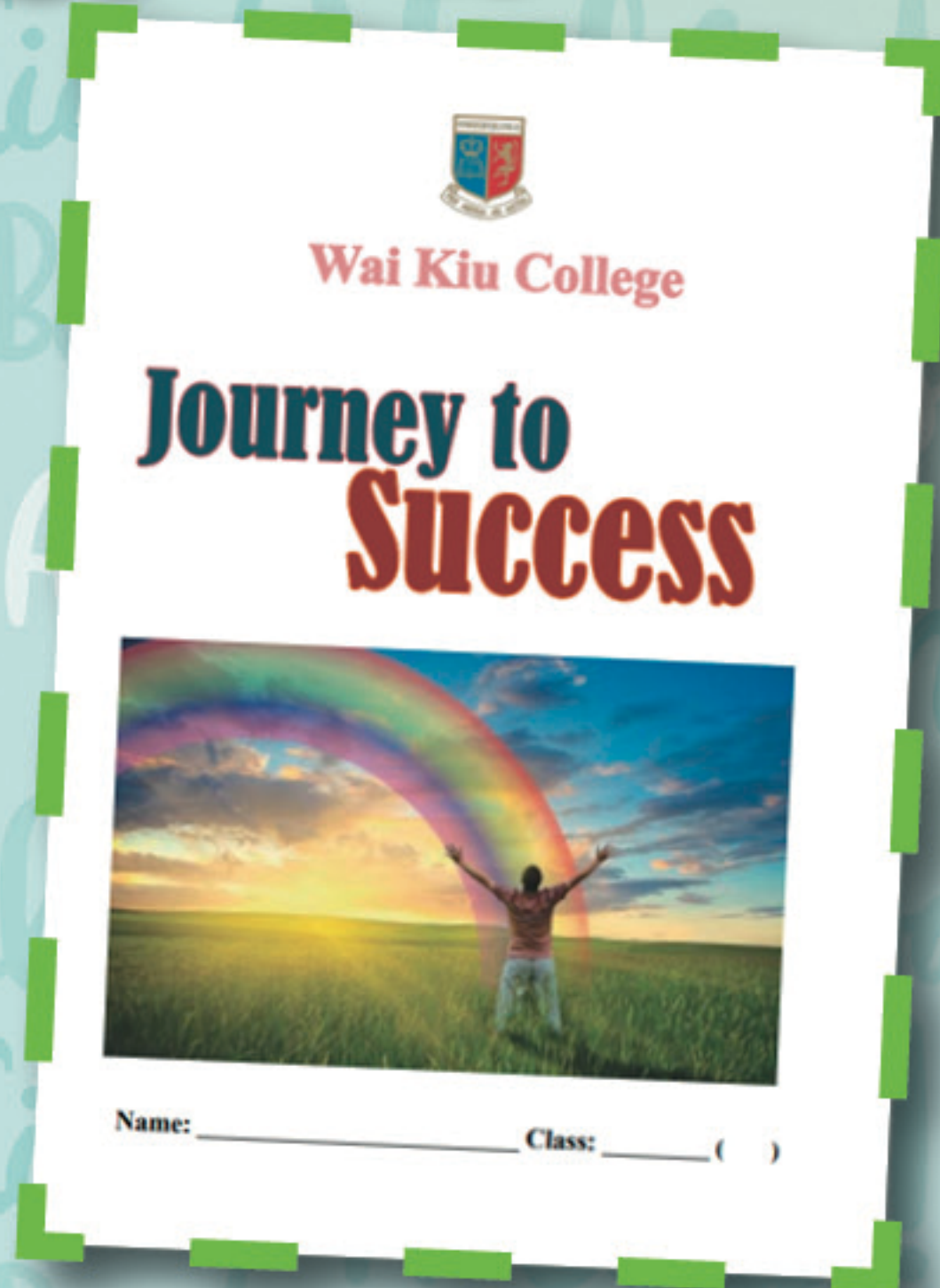

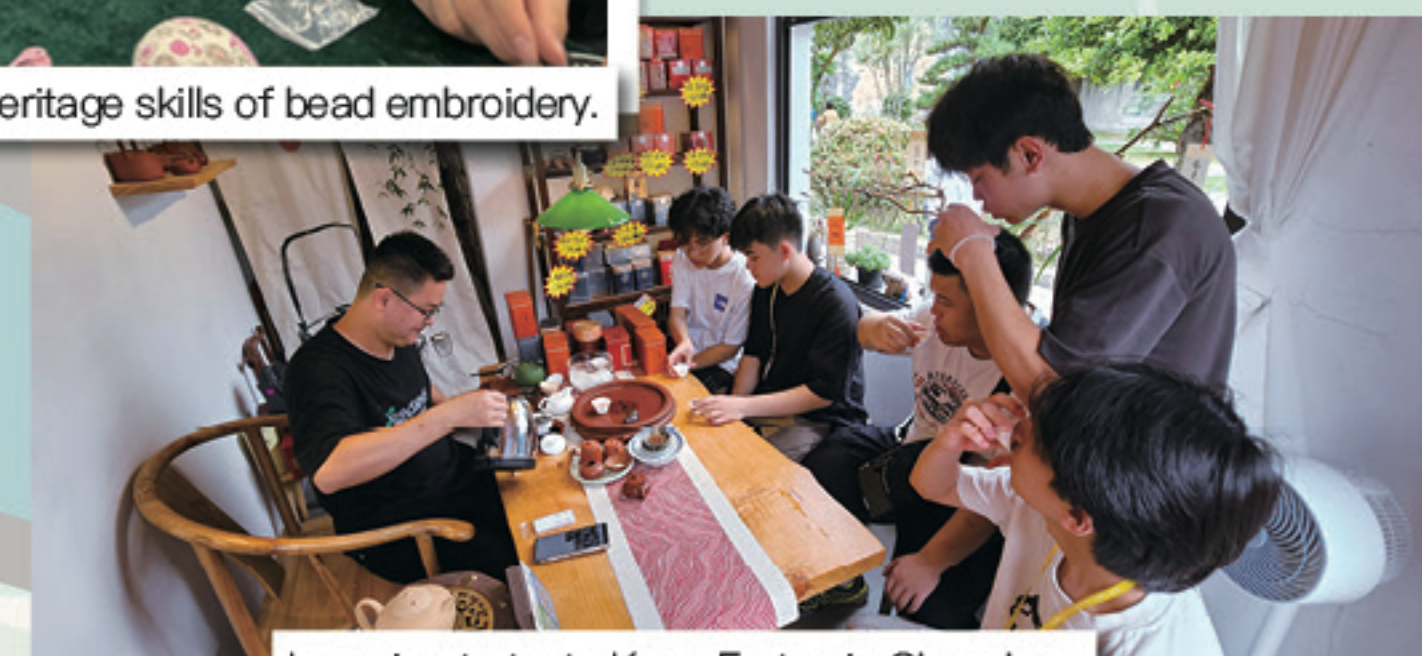
